SALARY OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE PAN AMERICAN SANITARY BUREAU

The Fifty-second World Health Assembly of WHO, upon the recommendation of the Executive Board and in keeping with the decision of the General Assembly of the United Nations to revise the base/floor salary scale for staff in the professional and higher categories, established the annual salaries for staff in ungraded posts and for the Director-General (Resolution WHA52.13).

It should be pointed out that the recommendation of the Executive Board approved by the World Health Assembly was based on the review carried out by the International Civil Service Commission concerning the base/floor salary scale for the professional and higher categories. The purpose of the revision was to reflect an increase of 2.48% through the consolidation of post adjustment classes into the net base salary, on a "no loss – no gain" basis, with effect from 1 March 1999.

Staff Rule 330.3 provides that the salary of the Director will be fixed by the Pan American Sanitary Conference or the Directing Council.

Since 1969, the practice of the Governing Bodies of PAHO has been to maintain the salary of the Director at the Under Secretary-General level of the UN system salary scale, which in the past WHO structure corresponded to the WHO Deputy Director-General.

In accordance with Resolution CD20.R20 of the 20th Directing Council (1971), which requested the Executive Committee, in cases of any future salary adjustments in respect of professional and ungraded categories of posts, to make recommendations to the Conference or the Directing Council concerning the appropriate level of the salary of the Director, the Executive Committee at its 124th Session dealt with the subject as set forth in Document CE124/23 (see Annex A) and adopted Resolution CE124.R11 (Annex B).

After considering the matter, the Directing Council may wish to adopt a resolution along the following lines:

Proposed Resolution

THE 41st DIRECTING COUNCIL.

Considering the revision made to the base/floor salary scale for the professional and higher-graded categories of staff, effective 1 March 1999;

Taking into account the decision by the Executive Committee at its 124th Session to adjust the salaries of the Deputy Director and Assistant Director (Resolution CE124.R11);

Having noted the recommendation of the Executive Committee concerning the salary of the Director of the Pan American Sanitary Bureau (Resolution CE124.R11); and

Bearing in mind the provisions of Staff Rule 330.3,

RESOLVES:

To establish the annual net salary of the Director of the Pan American Sanitary Bureau at \$104,662 (dependency rate) and \$94,190 (single rate), effective 1 March 1999.

AMENDMENTS TO THE PASB STAFF RULES

In accordance with the provisions of Staff Rule 020, the Director submits to the Executive Committee, as annex to this document, for confirmation, the amendments to the Staff Rules he has made since the 122nd Session.

These revisions are in line with those adopted by the Executive Board of the World Health Organization at its 103rd Session (Resolutions EB103.R15 and EB103.R16) and are in compliance with paragraph 2 of Resolution CD59.R19 adopted by the Executive Committee at its 59th Session (1968), which requested the Director to continue to introduce changes as he deems necessary to maintain close similarity between the provisions of the Staff Rules of the Pan American Sanitary Bureau (PASB) and those of the World Health Organization (WHO).

The amendments presented result from decisions taken by the United Nations General Assembly at its fifty-third session on the basis of recommendations made by the International Civil Service Commission (ICSC), in accordance with United Nations common system arrangements.

The amendments implement the results of periodic updates by the Commission, based on established methodologies. The annex to this document contains the text of the amended Staff Rules. The effective dates of these changes are 1 January 1999 and 1 March 1999, as appropriate.

The budgetary implications of the amendments in the 1998-1999 biennium include a minimum additional cost under the regular budget, which will have to be met from the appropriate allocations established.

The Committee is invited to consider a draft resolution which confirms the amendments contained in this document, modifies the remuneration of staff in ungraded posts, and recommends to the 41st Directing Council modification of the remuneration of the Director.

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1. Schedule of Salaries for the Professional and Higher-graded Categories

The United Nations General Assembly approved, with effect from 1 March 1999, the revised base/floor salary scale for the professional and higher-graded categories, incorporating an increase of 2.48% through the consolidation of post adjustment classes into the net base salary, on a "no loss-no gain" basis. Changes will also be required to the schedule of staff assessment rates for professional and higher-graded staff.

Staff Rules 330.1.1 and 330.2 have been modified accordingly.

2. Salaries of the Deputy Director and Assistant Director, and of the Director

As a consequence of the revision of the base/floor salary scale for professional and higher-graded categories described above, modifications in the salaries of the posts of Deputy Director, Assistant Director, and Director should also be made.

Since 1962 it has been the policy of the Executive Committee to set the salary of the Deputy Director at the level of other WHO Regional Directors and that of the Assistant Director at \$1,000 less.

Considering that PASB Staff Regulation 3.1 states: "The salaries for the Deputy Director and Assistant Director shall be determined by the Director of the Bureau with the approval of the Executive Committee," the Committee may wish to follow this practice and adjust the annual net salary of the Deputy Director to \$95,995 per annum at dependency rate and \$86,926 per annum at single rate, and that of the Assistant Director to \$94,995 per annum at dependency rate and \$85,926 per annum at single rate, effective 1 March 1999.

The 20th Directing Council, in operative paragraph 2 of Resolution CD20.R20, requested "the Executive Committee, in case of any future adjustments in respect of professional and ungraded categories of posts, to make recommendations to the Conference or the Directing Council concerning the appropriate level of the salary of the Director."

Since 1969, the practice of the Governing Bodies of PAHO has been to maintain the salary of the Director at the USG level of the UN system salary scale, which in the past WHO structure corresponded to the WHO Deputy Director-General.

The Executive Committee, following this guide, may wish to recommend to the 41st Directing Council that it adjust the annual net salary of the Director to \$104,662 per annum at dependency rate and \$94,190 per annum at single rate, effective 1 March 1999.

The above changes are also on the basis of the "no loss-no gain" formula.

3. Dependents' Allowances

With respect to the professional and higher-graded categories of staff, the children's allowance has been increased from \$1,510 to \$1,730 and the secondary dependent's allowance from \$540 to \$619. The allowance for disabled children, being double the children's allowance, has been increased from \$3,020 to \$3,460, all increases coming into effect on 1 January 1999.

Staff Rules 340.1, 340.2, and 340.3 have been amended accordingly.

4. Education Grant

As a result of a proposed change in the method for computing the reimbursement of additional boarding costs at locations where educational facilities are not available, the International Civil Service Commission is recommending a change in the dollar amount as expressed in the Staff Rule and establishment of amounts in certain other currencies. Amended Rules 350.1 and 350.2.2 are shown in the Annex.

5. Budgetary Implications

The budgetary implications of the above changes, which are minimal for all sources, will be met, in the regular budget, from the allocations established for the biennium 1998-1999.

6. Action by the Executive Committee

In the light of these revisions the Committee may wish to consider the following:

Recognizing the need for uniformity of conditions of employment of PASB and WHO staff,

RESOLVES:

- 1. To confirm the amendments to the Staff Rules of the Pan American Sanitary Bureau submitted by the Director in the Annex to Document CE124/23:
- (a) with effect from 1 January 1999 concerning the dependent's allowances for the professional and higher-graded categories of staff;
- (b) with effect from the school year in force on 1 January 1999 concerning the education grant;
- (c) with effect from 1 March 1999 concerning the salary scale and the rates of staff assessment for use in conjunction with gross base salaries applicable to staff in the professional and higher-graded categories.
- 2. To establish, effective 1 March 1999:
- (a) the annual net salary of the Deputy Director at \$95,995 at dependency rate and \$86,926 at single rate;
- (b) the annual net salary of the Assistant Director at \$94,995 at dependency rate and \$85,926 at single rate.
- 3. To recommend to the 41st Directing Council that it establish the annual net salary of the Director at \$104,662 at dependency rate and \$94,190 at single rate, effective 1 March 1999.

340. DEPENDENTS' ALLOWANCES

A staff member in a post of professional or higher grade, except for short-term staff members appointed under Rule 1320 or consultants appointed under Rule 1330, is entitled to a dependent's allowance for dependents as defined in Rule 310.5, to be paid as follows:

- 340.1 **US\$ 1,730** per annum for a child, except that in cases where there is no dependent spouse the first dependent child is not entitled to an allowance. The entitlement shall be reduced by the amount of any benefit paid from any other public source by way of social security payments, or under public law, by reason of such child.
- 340.2 **US\$ 3,460** per annum for a child who is physically or mentally incapacitated subject to the conditions defined in Rule 340.1 except that if the staff member has no dependent spouse and receives the "with dependent" rate of net salary by virtue of such child, an allowance of **US\$ 1,730** shall be payable.

340.3 US\$ 619 per year for a father, mother, brother or

350. EDUCATION GRANT

350.1 An internationally recruited staff member shall be entitled to an education grant, except as indicated in Rule 350.3. The amount of the grant payable under this Rule shall be 75% of the education expenses actually incurred and admissible under Rule 350.2. The maximum grant per child per year shall not exceed a total payment of US\$9,750 or, for expenses incurred in certain currencies as determined by the Director on the basis of procedures agreed among the international organizations concerned, an amount established in those currencies. For staff members at certain designated official stations, the amount of the grant in respect of primary and secondary education shall be increased by an additional amount corresponding to 100% of boarding costs up to US\$ 4,746 per child per year or, for expenses incurred in certain local currencies as determined by the Director on the basis of procedures agreed among the international organizations concerned, an amount established in those currencies.

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350.2 This grant is payable for:

The cost of full-time attendance at an educational institution outside the country or area of the official station, including the cost of board if provided by the institution. Where board is not provided by the institution, a flat amount is paid in lieu. The flat amount per child per year shall be US\$ 3,164 or, for expenses incurred in certain currencies as determined by the Director on the basis of procedures agreed among the international organizations concerned, an amount established in those currencies. For staff members at certain designated official stations the flat amount in respect of primary and secondary education is US\$ 4,746, or for expenses incurred in certain currencies as determined by the Director on the basis of procedures agreed among the international organizations concerned, an amount established in those currencies.
